

Back in October 2022, the Intake Team was contacted by Alison and Andy who were seeking help for two abandoned cats who appeared in the garden of their Brooklyn home looking forlorn and bedraggled. They began to feed them and interact with them but knew they couldn't keep them because they had several resident cats already and were at their limit. One of the cats was a tabby they named Tom and the other pale orange and white tabby they named Angus. It was obvious from the beginning that they were very bonded and also likely former house cats given that they were extremely loving and easy to handle.

Things were looking good for their eventual adoption. We worked with Alison to find low cost vetting for the boys to get them ready for a new home through KittyKind. We were heartbroken when their blood work showed that both cats were FIV AND FeLV positive which severely limited their chances of adoption




Above; Angus and Tom; left: Angus does the dishes; below: Tom the senior





When they read the story about Tom and Angus on KittyKind's website they felt a connection to them and asked to meet them. By that time the boys had moved from Alison's yard to a foster home arranged by Doug and Brooke from Ready for Rescue. Introductions were made and soon we received the wonderful news that Tom and Angus had found their forever home. Sometimes the road isn't straight or easy but when caring people work together in rescue the results can be amazing.
